Introduction

Because of the numerous activities involved in warehouse operations, employees in warehouse settings may be at greater risk for accidents than people who work in areas with more limited activities. Hence, companies prioritize warehouse safety.

General Hazards

Common types of hazard in a warehouse setting are slips, trips and falls. These accidents are normally caused when staff lose their balance or stumble over something that has not been put away properly. Removing or placing things from storage can lead to a fumble or slip, potentially causing both item and employee to fall. The potential for slips, trips and falls is increased when workers are moving supplies on various types of floor surfaces and on various levels. One more common danger is getting hit by falling items. This is normally caused by failure to properly stack items on shelves and other surfaces. Back injuries due to incorrect lifting methods are one more common danger.

Warehouse equipment carries inherent hazards. Accidents or injuries could be caused by conveyors, hand trucks and forklift trucks if they are not operated right. Warehouse tools, such as pallets, skids, strapping and cutting tools, have to be used carefully in loading, packing and unpacking.

Hazardous substances, combustible or flammable materials could pose hazards while being stored in a warehouse. Staff have to know how to take steps to protect themselves from health dangers when working around hazardous materials.
